Mr. Jett congratulated the boys golf team for their 2nd place finish in the Brooks Invitational. The boys shot 291 which is the lowest team score at FPHS since 2019. Tyler Coley won the individual with a 3 under par score of 69. JP Groat finished 2nd with a 70.
